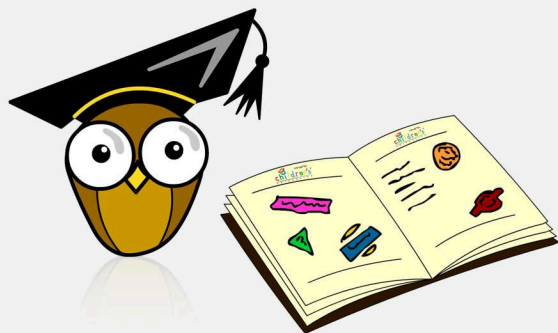


What would my staff need to do?

All children who are taking part in the scheme have been given a passport by their school. Your staff need to be willing to put a stamp or sticker in the passport to show that they have attended an activity.



You will be given a Learning Destination sticker to display at your premises so that children and their parents know they can use their passports with you.



What do we need to do to get involved?

Registering as a Learning Destination is a simple and straightforward process taking an hour at most and lasting for three years.

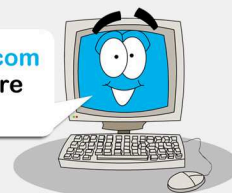
The validation process asks simple questions about the quality of learning that takes place in your organisation and your safeguarding procedures.

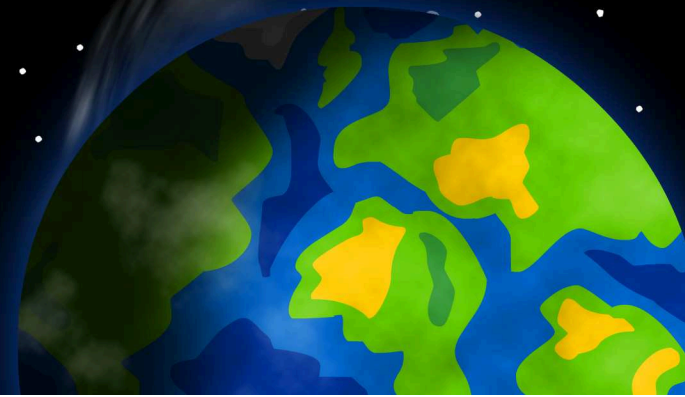

What is the Children's University™?

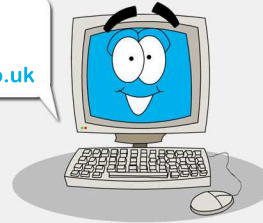
The Children's University™ is a national organisation that provides 7 to 14 year olds with exciting and innovative learning activities and experiences outside normal school hours.

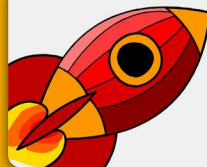
What types of activities will you include?
